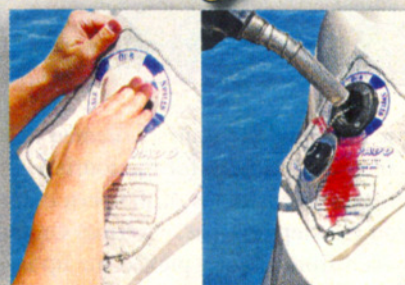
See and be Seen

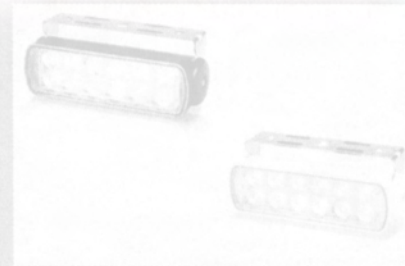
